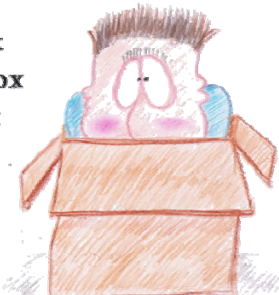

Are you a lead soprano in an Opera company or the foghorn on an ocean liner? Regardless, the Bible says you should sing to God. All through the psalms King David urges people to sing praises. The words 'sing' and 'praise' appear some fifty times, along with variations on the same idea: 'cried out to him with my mouth' (Psalm 66:17) and 'shout to God with joy' (Psalm 47:1). Part of loving, praising, and thanking God is doing it out loud. Why? Because God deserves it. We should be overflowing with joy and gratitude for the good things he has done for us throughout our life. Even on a bad day, we still have a lot to be grateful for! If we allowed ourselves to really express our joy, we couldn't keep quiet about God, just as we wouldn't keep quiet about a huge department store sale or a free latte

at the local coffee shop. We'd be spruiking on the street corner. And yet we have so much more to celebrate than a free coffee! So sing to God - to his ears, you sound perfect. '*All you who fear God, come and listen, and I will tell you what he has done for me. I cried out to him with my mouth and praised him with my tongue.*' and '*Praise God, who did not ignore my prayer or hold back his love from me*' (Psalm 66:16-17 & 20) (*adapted from "Becoming" Wisdom books of the Old Testament*)

Genesis 18:1-10 Psalm 14 Colossians 1:24-28 Luke 10:38-42

EXPLORING THE WORD

On the first reading of this text, many of us would feel sympathy with Martha who is left to do all the work. But a more careful reading of the text uncovers the real problem. Martha is ready 'to welcome Jesus into her house'. And yet she becomes so preoccupied with the fuss of getting food ready she is failing to do exactly what she set out to do: offer welcome to the person of Jesus. Mary, on the other hand is attentive to the words and teachings of Jesus. Who has offered the true welcome? The responses of these two women are not in opposition, but rather indicate two ways of acting which should become integrated in how we relate to others: attentive friendship and generous and practical service. The Gospel of the Good Samaritan from last week shows us a model of selfless service. Here we are presented with the other side of the story: the need to also be attentive and listen to the word of God so that we don't get caught up in that which ultimately is not important.
