### COMMUNITY AND WORSHIP

#### *Angela's column*

In *Made, Not Born* (1976) Benedictine liturgist Aidan Kavanagh wrote of the RCIA: "I would hazard that this document may well appear to a writer a century from now as the most important result of Vatican 2 for the life of the Church. ...because of the concrete, robust and disciplined vision it projects of the Church as a community of faith lived in common."

To people who have grown up with the notion of Church as a place where 'Father does all the important things', the RCIA proposal is a model of church that is vastly different. Quoting from two Council documents, the Rite says: *the people of God, as represented by the local Church, should understand and show by their concern that the initiation of adults is the responsibility of all the baptised. In the various circumstances of daily life, all the followers of Christ have the obligation of spreading the faith*

*according to their abilities. Hence, the entire community must help the candidates and the catechumens throughout the process of initiation"* (RCIA 9). It is not simply a matter of handing out a book. It tells us that Christianity is a 'living faith' into which we welcome new members, a faith that is lived out, and shared by fellow believers in the midst of daily life.

*"...the entire Church will accompany and lead them to encounter Christ"* (RCIA 108)

How's the praying going? If you read my column last week you may remember what I'm on about. (Just adding prayer to my topic list.) *Kings 19:16.19-21 Psalm 15 Galatians 5:1.13-18 Luke 9:51-62*

### EXPLORING THE WORD

This Gospel text marks a turning point in Luke's story of Jesus. He has made a momentous decision. When he is rejected by the very first village he approaches, the disciples want to punish them. But Jesus refuses violence and coercion as a means of conversion. He wants willing disciples! The following three brief exchanges outline what is needed for discipleship: it won't necessarily be comfortable; there is a sense of urgency and it requires single-mindedness and sometime difficult choices. Comfort or family relationship cannot take priority over the kingdom of God and once one becomes a follower of Christ there can be no turning back. This Gospel is not only about Jesus; it is about all those who seek to follow the road God has laid out for them.



- What difficulties have you experienced on the road with Christ?
- One of the characters in this text says, 'I will follow you wherever you go'. Why do you continue on this journey?
