Isaiah 66:10-14 Psalm 65 Galatians 6:14-18 Luke 10:1-12. 17-20

EXPLORING THE WORD

At the very end of Luke's Gospel, Jesus' final instruction to the disciples is to proclaim the good news to all the nations (Lk 24-47). In today's text it is almost as if Jesus is throwing them into the deep-end! They are sent out on their first missionary assignment as raw recruits, with little to help them, but the lesson they learn here will be greatly needed later. Whatever they seek to achieve in Jesus' name, they are given the assistance they need. Jesus, however, reminds them that the crucial factor is not that they are powerful or that they are successful. What really matters is that they are doing the will of God, in Jesus' name, and it is this which is the reason for their ultimate salvation.
